ACADEMIC ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admittance to the MSc programme in Neuroscience and Neuroimaging is based on:

- A successfully completed bachelor's degree (or equivalent) or higher.
- A high-level of English language proficiency.

Examples of eligible bachelor's degrees to the MSc programme in Neuroscience and Neuroimaging are:

BSc in Biochemistry, BSc in Biology, BSc in Biomedicine, BSc in Biotechnology, BSc in Biomedical engineering and informatics, BA in Cognitive science, BSc in Electrical engineering, BSc in Healthcare technology engineering, BSc in Medical chemistry, BSc in Medicine, BSc in Molecular biology, BSc in Molecular medicine, BSc in Nanoscience, BSc in Pharmacology, BSc in Physics and BSc in Sports science.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Students must be above average in at least one of the following categories:

Mathematics & technology	Biology & chemistry	Medicine & cognition

In evaluating qualified applicants, the admissions committee assesses each applicant based on the following criteria and on the supplied documented information hence marks/grades obtained after the application deadline are not included.

Academic background (75%)

This criterion includes average mark of a BSc degree and the average mark of relevant courses weighted after the study load (ECTS credits)

Other relevant experiences (25%)

Relevant work experience, Bachelor projects, laboratory projects etc.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

English language skills equivalent to an 'English B level' in Denmark are required and can be documented as listed below. Graduates from a Danish "Gymnasium" have at least an English level B by default.

- **IELTS**: Minimum score of 6.5
- TOEFL with a minimum score of:

577 Points in the paper-based test *or*

233 Points in the computer-based test *or*

90 Points in the internet-based test

Cambridge ESOL examinations

Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) or First Certificate with grade A as a minimum. Applicants must upload their **Confirmation of Entry** stating **candidate ID number** and **candidate secret number**, which are not stated on the test result itself.





CEFR validated English language course
 C1 level

Applicants exempted from submitting an English test are:

- "Native speakers" with a qualifying exam taught in English (including applicants with a qualifying exam from either USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Great Britain, Scotland, or Ireland taught in English).
- Applicants holding either a Danish/Nordic/Duborg/<u>International Baccalaureate</u> (<u>from the IB diploma programme</u>)/European Baccalaureate (from the "ScholaEuropaea") diploma with English language proficiency equivalent to <u>English level B in Denmark</u>.
- Applicants with an English language bachelor's and/or master's degree from USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Great Britain, Scotland or Ireland. It must be documented that the teaching language was English.
